

Instructions for Voting

Ballots are mailed more than 18 days prior to each election.

Each packet will consist of a ballot, secrecy sleeve, and a return envelope which contains the voter's declaration.

Mark your ballot by shading the oval next to your choice using a blue or black pen.

When done, insert the ballot into the secrecy sleeve and insert the secrecy sleeve into the return envelope. Be sure to sign the voter's declaration on the return envelope.

Note that although two people may witness a mark of someone unable to sign, signing by power of attorney is not allowed.

Ballots must be returned or postmarked by election day to be valid. Ballots sent through the USPS require first class postage. Ballots dropped off in an **official ballot drop box** do not require postage.

To correct a vote, follow instructions on your ballot. If you damage, spoil or misplace your ballot, please contact our office at (509) 524-2530 for a replacement.
